

Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

In a year that will be remembered for its challenges, Habitat for Humanity MetroWest/Greater Worcester is counting our blessings.

The first 9 months of this Fiscal Year were hopeful months full of strong growth. Through strong partnerships with our Cities and Towns, our project pipeline has grown. Our hammers were swinging at the sites of 2 new homes with 3 more ready to begin, and excitement was building toward our annual Women Build and Operation Playhouse events which were slated to support the largest turnouts yet.



In March, our world turned upside down. Rather than bringing large groups together to build homes, communities and hope, we were suddenly faced with the simultaneous challenges of keeping people separated from one another while offering a safety net to our homeowner families, many of whom were abruptly facing challenges in their ability to pay their mortgage.

Through fast action and difficult decisions, remarkable collaborations, and an incredible amount of support, we were able to reduce and stabilize operations, while being able to say "Yes" to every one of our homeowners who requested assistance.

And through it all, we learned. We learned that, especially in times of crisis, donors like you are dedicated to supporting Affordable Housing. We learned that the ReStores are providing critical services to our communities. We learned that by challenging our assumptions, rethinking operations, and collaborating across the public, private, and governmental sectors, we can overcome any obstacle that we face.

We are optimistic for the new year. Both experts and advocates say the pandemic hasn't created a housing crisis. It is exposing, and exacerbating, the problems that already existed.¹ Safely sheltering at home requires a safe home in which to shelter, and that should be available to all of the members of our communities. This need is urgent. We are more dedicated and energized to achieve this goal than ever. And we believe that with you on our side, we will succeed.

- Operation Playhouse: Playhouses provide a special place for a veteran or military family to bond, play, dream, and think! In a single day, sponsor teams build, decorate, and donate playhouses to veteran or military families.
- **Home Repair:** Repair program that focuses on accessibility, safety, and code issues to keep local families in their homes.
- Neighborhood Revitalization: Multi-year effort to revitalize an entire neighborhood.
- A Brush With Kindness: Minor exterior improvements that include painting, landscaping, and minor repair services for qualified individuals.

Meet William and Justin, Coreen's boys, with their dog, Tuck (photographed to the right). Tuck was picked up as a stray somewhere in the South and transported to New England. Coreen, a single Mom, knew how much her boys longed for a pet. So, in the middle of a January snowstorm, Tuck was rescued by Coreen and welcomed with love into their Habitat home.



Coreen said, "Tuck touched my heart right away. He needed a new start and a forever home where he could be safe, just like us. The Habitat home we live in got a new start by being rebuilt rather than torn down. Just like myself and my children, Tuck got a new start with a safe home and loving family."

Since 1985, we have built homes throughout our service area in MetroWest and Greater Worcester, providing homeownership opportunities for 52 families in need of safe, affordable housing.

Every day, more families find themselves in a struggle to keep a decent roof over their heads. Caught in punishing cycles of unpredictable rent increases, overcrowded conditions, or lack of access to affordable financing, many families live with a constant burden of stress and fear.

Helping families leave that cycle behind is why we build. When a family can create a decent place to live that's affordable, everything can change—and so much change is desperately needed.

Each family we partner with takes an active role in their success. Helping to build their home alongside volunteers, taking finance classes, learning about homeownership and becoming an active member of the community are a few of the ways we build homes **with** families, not **for** them. Through shelter, we empower.

Every parent, every person, should have the decent shelter they need to thrive.

Through the Home Repair program, we support families and veterans who need help maintaining the home where they live. Focusing on exterior and code related issues, we work to keep families in their homes with safety and dignity.

By adding wheelchair ramps, repairing roofs, and a range of other work, we are able to help families stay in the homes they know and love. As with our home builds, families partner with us to ensure each repair is a hand up—not a hand out—by repaying a loan and investing sweat equity on a Habitat project.

Operation Playhouse:

• In FY2020 we built 31 playhouses. Starting in March of 2020, we halted this program due to health and safety concerns, which reduced the number of playhouses that were planned for this year.

Children of veterans and military families are often left with a one-parent household and have to cope with feelings of loss and uncertainty. The playhouses provide a special place for family members to bond, play, dream, and think. It is a "home" of their own.

We are proud to give back to those who have served our country and encourage our partners to do the same. Habitat for Humanity MetroWest/Greater Worcester is one of just a few Habitat affiliates across the U.S. to honor service men and women through Operation Playhouse.

Every purchase at our ReStores help local families build strength, stability, and self-reliance through affordable housing. ReStores accept donations and sell a constantly changing inventory of diverse, high quality merchandise to the public at a fraction of the retail price, while diverting reusable household items and building materials from the waste stream.

A good deal for you, your community, and the environment.

Worcester revenue - 7% Year over Year growth*

July 1st, 2018 – March 20th, 2019 Gross Income* = \$492,690.59 July 1st, 2019 – March 20th, 2020 Gross Income* = \$526,228.54

Ashland revenue - 22% Year over Year growth*

July 1st, 2018 – March 20th, 2019 Gross Income* = \$285,851.48 July 1st, 2019 – March 20th, 2020 Gross Income* = \$348,723.18

*Note that gross income is comparing the time when our ReStores were open in FY20 to the equivalent timeframe in 2019.

- The story of this past year is one of dedication and adaptability by all team members who have given maximum effort to contribute to Habitat's mission. We witnessed engagement with our ReStores in new ways in the face of uncertainty.
- Gift cards and online stores were rolled out for both Ashland and Worcester locations. Visit our online store at www.letsrestoreonline.org.
- One of the many financial impacts of COVID-19 was a substantial decline in Habitat ReStore profit nationally. While many stores had to close their doors and forgo revenue for several weeks or even months, operational expenses like rent, payroll, utilities, etc. continued. As a result, average store profit fell by 40%, and median profit fell by 48% nationally (comparing full year revenues to 2019).

*The 18,564 volunteer hours translates to an equivalent of 9 full-time employees! All of our volunteer programs came to halt during the week of March 16th 2020. Volunteer programs remained closed until June 2020.

Highlights

- The Worcester and Ashland ReStores built strong partnerships with repeat volunteer groups. The Worcester ReStore welcomed Shrewsbury High Schools National Honor Society students on an almost daily basis. The Ashland ReStore welcomed team members from Centage Corporation Intelligent Planning & Analytics on a monthly basis.
- In August of 2019 we welcomed a youth group from Great Neck, NY's All Saints Episcopal Church. Over the course of 5 days, the team of 8 led by Father Joseph Sanghoon Pae, worked at both our Holliston build site and at our Re-Store locations.



July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020


Revenues and Expenses



Sources of Income


